"... the rise of China probably is the single most determining feature of 21^{st} century geopolitics. ... People have a question mark and the question mark is very simple — you [China] are going to be this huge power, what is it that you want to use that power for and what are the values that make your country tick? ... I essentially believe that China's development is benign. But, I also believe one of the reasons why it's so important for us to be strong right now — you in America and us in Europe — and for us to have some confidence in our own value system is because I think that strength will be an important part of ensuring that [China's] development is benign." ~ Tony Blair, Prime Minister of the United Kingdom; Quarter Representative to the Middle East

"The relationship [between the United States and the United Kingdom] is important. I think it is precisely because there are new centers of power emerging that it is important for those who basically share our values — freedom, the rule of law, commitment to democracy — we should stick together at this moment.
